Min 5/23-24: WELCOMING REMARKS AND INTRODUCTIONS

The meeting was called to order by the Board Member Cherono Kosgey at 10:27am and she said a prayer. The vice chair did an introduction of Board Members present. In a short while he welcomed all the attendees and gave them chance to introduce themselves.

After introductions she read through the agenda of the day.

MIN6/23-24. MUNICIPALITY SERVICE DELIVERY

Mr. Richard Kirui Municipal Manager presented an overview of the current municipality service delivery framework, focusing on essential services such as Revenue collection, water, sanitation, waste management, road infrastructure, and public health services. The municipality's efforts to improve service delivery to the community were outlined, alongside ongoing projects aimed at addressing gaps and enhancing efficiency.

Key discussion areas:-

- **Revenue Collection:** Concerns raising revenue collection by coming up with more revenue avenues
- **Water Supply and Sanitation:** Concerns were raised regarding unreliable water supply in some areas, with community members requesting more frequent updates on maintenance schedules. The municipality reassured the public that ongoing water infrastructure upgrades are planned.

- **Road Maintenance:** Attendees emphasized the need for better road maintenance in rural areas and requested faster action on pothole repairs.
- **Waste Management:** Some residents suggested improvements to waste collection schedules, particularly in the high-density areas.
- **Public Health Services:** There were calls for better access to health facilities, especially in outlying areas.

MIN7/23-24. MUNICIPALITY POLICIES - GENDER MAINSTREAMING POLICY

Social Service Welfare officer – Miss Judith Cheleule provided an overview of the municipality's Gender Mainstreaming Policy, which aims to promote gender equality in municipal decision-making, service delivery, and employment practices. The policy focuses on ensuring that both women and men benefit equally from municipal programs, and that gender considerations are integrated into all municipal operations and services.

She emphasized on the following points:-

- (1) **Inclusion of Women in Leadership:** Several participants stressed the importance of increasing female representation in leadership positions within the municipality, including council and management roles.
- (2) **Equal Access to Services:** Attendees highlighted challenges faced by women and girls in accessing municipal services, particularly in rural areas. There was a call for gender-sensitive programming to ensure services meet the needs of all genders.
- (3) **Domestic Violence and Support Services:** There were requests for the municipality to establish more comprehensive support systems for survivors of domestic violence.

It was agreed that

- (a) A strategy to increase women's participation in local government will be developed and promoted.
- (b) Gender-sensitive service delivery guidelines will be reviewed and updated to ensure more inclusive municipal services.
- (c) The municipality will collaborate with local organizations to create more support networks for survivors of domestic violence.

MIN 8/23-24. MUNICIPAL INVESTMENT PLAN

Mr. Kirui Municipal Manager presented and discussed the municipality's investment plan, outlining priorities for attracting investment into the local economy.

The plan includes strategies to improve infrastructure, support local businesses, and attract external investors to boost job creation and economic growth. He further informed the public that through investment plan a number of benefits are:-

- Business Environment:** There were concerns raised by local entrepreneurs about the ease of doing business in the municipality. Some participants suggested improving access to funding and reducing bureaucratic hurdles.
- Job Creation:** The need for more focused investment in sectors that can create local employment opportunities, such as agriculture, tourism, and technology, was highlighted.
- Public-Private Partnerships:** Attendees requested that the municipality explore more opportunities for public-private partnerships to enhance infrastructure development.

The public unanimously agreed on action Items:

- Regular updates on water infrastructure improvements will be shared with the community.
- A roadmap for road repair and maintenance will be provided to local residents.
- Review of waste management systems will be conducted to improve efficiency.
- Plans to increase healthcare facilities in underserved areas will be explored.

Closing Remarks & Adjournment

The Vice Chair thanked the attendees for their valuable input and emphasized the importance of continued public participation in shaping the municipality's plans. It was noted that the discussions and action items outlined in the meeting will be incorporated into ongoing efforts to improve service delivery, promote gender equality, and attract investment to the area.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:40PM
