

MINUTES OF PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ENGAGEMENT MEETING ON 17TH MAY 2024 AT 9AM-HELD IN KAPKWEN MARKET BY BOMET MUNICIPALITY

Preliminaries

The meeting was called in order by Kipkononden Towett – Member Bomet Municipality Board and an opening prayer was made by Rev. Stanley Cheruiyot - Kapkwen market

Agenda:

1. Sensitization on Municipality Integrated Development Plan (IDeP) and Projects

MIN 13/23-24: SENSITIZATION ON MUNICIPALITY INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT PLAN (IDEP) AND PROJECTS

Mr. Eric Chirchir Municipal Planner presented the Municipality's Integrated Development Plan (IDeP), highlighting the objectives and strategies aimed at enhancing infrastructure, public services, and social welfare.

The IDeP outlines key projects that will address the needs of the community, including upgrading roads, sanitation, and housing.

The Key Points Raised includes and not limited to the following: -

- ✓ The importance of public participation in the planning and execution of development projects was emphasized.
- ✓ Attendees were encouraged to contribute suggestions on local development priorities.
- ✓ Questions were raised about how residents could engage with the ongoing and upcoming projects. The presenter assured the public that there would be continued communication through town hall meetings and other forms of outreach.

MIN 14/23-24: IMPROVEMENT OF ROAD NETWORK IN THE MARKET

The Municipal Manager provided an update on the ongoing improvements to the road network in the market area.

The plan includes expanding existing roads, improving drainage, and ensuring better traffic management to ease congestion and enhance the market's accessibility.

The Key points raised by Traders and residents expressed concern over the disruption caused by construction activities but acknowledged the long-term benefits of the road improvements.

Some attendees raised concerns about the safety of pedestrians and the need for traffic control measures during construction.

MIN 15/23-24: SENSITIZING TRADERS ON THE DANGERS OF TRADING ON THE ROADSIDE

Mr. Kipkononden Towett and Madam Flavian Kenduiywa took turns to sensitize the public on dangers of trading along the roadside, they discussed the risks associated with trading along the roadside, including accidents, congestion, and illegal occupation of public spaces. The importance of creating designated market areas for traders was emphasized to improve safety and order.

The traders highlighted some issues yet to be addressed as:-

- Traders voiced concerns about the lack of alternative spaces for their businesses, which has led to the proliferation of roadside trading.
- The municipality proposed the development of a new designated market area to accommodate traders and ensure their safety.
- The need for education on road safety and the potential legal implications for roadside traders was also highlighted.

MIN 16/23-24: PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT AND FEEDBACK SESSION

- A follow-up meeting will be organized for a detailed discussion on specific projects under the IDeP.
- Residents will be invited to submit feedback on development priorities via surveys and community meetings.
- A traffic management plan will be developed to minimize disruption during the road improvement works.
- The project's progress will be monitored, with regular updates provided to the public through community meetings

- A public awareness campaign will be launched to educate traders on the dangers of roadside trading.
- A survey will be conducted to identify potential locations for a new market and alternative trading spaces.
- Traders will be consulted regarding the design and implementation of new market facilities.


CLOSING REMARKS AND ADJOURNMENT
