- (b) Introduction.

Min 2/5/2019: Unregulated Hawking: The members have registered their complains on surging numbers of hawkers who all selling various commodities along the road, streets. The commodity being hawked includes Charcoal, food stuffs. This has adversely affected business;

Volumes,

- These are also attempts by some people to re-construct kiosk inside the market.
- Interference of enforcement Officers by the political brokers.
- Unregulated hawking has denied the County Government of Bomet an opportunity to generate revenue.
- The hawkers have made the traders to incur a lot of losses since they throw away perishable food stuffs which they are enable to sell due to hawking menace.
- Unreliable water supply in the market has affected sanitation especially on washrooms and washing of food stuffs.
- Construction of illegal structures hepzardly.
- Shoe shiners shade are ready.
- An illegal butchery was installed and no action was taken.
- The enforcement operations has also affected.
- Boda boda shades constructed does not conform to the requirement of the users.

- The contractors are moving too slowly hence affecting the completion of the projects.
- Incomplete road work has affected business volumes in many business especially Brevan Hotel.
- Lorries/Vehicles offloading goods should be compelled to pay levies.
- The department of revenue should enhance revenue collection.
- Additional flood lights are required in the market especially to cover areas where the milk renders are selling their commodities.
- Erection of illegal structures should be stopped upon commencement rather than stopping it later.
- Contractors working on KUSP Project should be closely and supervised.
- Some traders are violating regulations with impunity purporting to have backing from the head office.
- The beneficiaries of economic infrastructure being carried out must be involved during the inception designs of the project.
- Charcoal dealers are complaining of small size of the stalls being constructed.
- The enforcement officers in the market should not be changed so often.
- Posters ushering buyers to the market to be displayed.

RESOLUTIONS.

1. Control access to the market should be protected to enhance security in the market.
 - (a) garbage pins should be set up in both entrance and exit.
 - (b) Two new enforcement officers have been introduced to the market.
 - © The number of enforcement should be increased by 193 to enhance operations.
2. Bomet town has been targeted to raise Ksh 40 Million in the current financial year.
3. Those intimidating County Government Official should be made to face the full force of the law.
4. Whoever belated the role of the town committees is a propagandist who do not have interest of Bomet at heart. Those purporting to support the Governor while undermining the government officers and regulations should be stopped forthwith.
5. The committee to set up the by-laws governing the market to regulate the issues of the market.
6. Water should be made available always and taps increased. These taps should be relocated away from the toilets and garbage bins.
